Performed by a spirited ensemble cast of actors and musicians, *A Christmas Carol* features almost two dozen traditional Christmas melodies including “God Rest Ye Merry Gentlemen,” “Good King Wenceslaus,” “Away in a Manger,” and “Here We Come A-Wassailing.” The production artfully recreates both the poverty and luxury of 19<sup>th</sup>-century London as a backdrop to the fable of Ebenezer Scrooge, a lonely man who is given the rarest of gifts...the chance to change his life and find his heart.
