CAPA's Education & Outreach programs enrich the lives of central Ohio residents by providing free and low-cost creative experiences that are varied, diverse, and accessible. We believe everyone in our community deserves to experience the transformative power of the arts and our many community collaborations enable us to fulfill that belief.



We are excited to return to in-person adjudications this year for our fourth annual CAPA Marquee Awards presented by American Electric Power Foundation. On May 10, the CAPA Marquee Awards will culminate with a red-carpet ceremony and student showcase at the Ohio

Theatre at which winners in all 11 categories will be announced.

Educational opportunities this year will include a return to our Broadway Master Class series with classes planned for HADESTOWN, FIDDLER ON THE ROOF, COME FROM AWAY, CATS, and PRETTY WOMAN.

Our Workshop series kicked off on October 9 with a very informative session on auditioning for college theatre programs. Additional workshops planned for this year include designing for the theatre, rock vocals with Shadowbox Live, and musical theatre dance audition.

We are also excited to announce our participation in the Broadway League's three-part virtual speaker series! Made up of Broadway professionals, this virtual series gives students the opportunity to explore non-performance topics. The first class on "Designing and Building a Show" will be held on December 1.






