Workshops will be announced in the fall and may include Vocal Performance, Acting & Improvisation, Dance & Movement, and Theatre Design and Technology.














Black Violin



Broadway for Kids









During the 2024-2025 season, we were thrilled to be able to award 807 tickets to students and educators from 16 schools in 7 central Ohio counties totaling more than \$32,000 in subsidies.

Thanks to the generous and ongoing support from our Broadway in Columbus season subscribers, we make the experience of Broadway available to the next generation of theatre goers in central Ohio.

Open to all public, private, and charter schools, this program provides subsidized tickets to help educators use the power of Broadway to serve as a tool to enhance their curriculum and make learning fun.

Applications will open on August 12 and will remain open until all tickets are awarded. Educators who apply are asked to supply information about their school, their classroom, and how they will connect the Broadway show to their classroom curriculum. A lesson plan demonstrating those curricular connections is also required.

This was the third summer of our intergenerational storytelling though the arts program, ARISE, a collaboration between CAPA, **GrowIN**, and The Ohio State University.

Ten ARISE Scholars were selected to participate this year: Tess Creamer from Westerville South High School; Mahita Gaddam from Dublin Jerome High School; **Shirley Gui** from Dublin Jerome High School; Harper Kelley from Fort Hayes Metropolitan Education Center; Alston **Laury** from Bishop Hartley High School; Dariana Ochoa from Arts & College Preparatory Academy; Dylan Pack from Marysville High School; Aruzhan Taizhanova from Dublin Scioto High School; Shreeya Varala from Dublin Jerome High School; and Clara Zahrndt from Dublin Coffman High School. Four mentors from Ohio State University and Columbus State Community College and eight older adults from At Home By High and Our Home Senior Living made up the 22 participants.





Teen scholars worked with teaching artists and college mentors on Tuesdays to prepare for their weekly sessions with the older adults. On Wednesdays, the teens and mentors met adult participants at the Golden Buckeye Center for Dementia Caregiving, and with the help of a teaching artist, used creative mediums such as drama, dance, visual arts, and songs to tell stories, build new relationships, and find connections across generations.



In November 2024, the Center for HumanKindness at The **Columbus Foundation named** ARISE a HumanKindness Prize honoree. The HumanKindness Prize recognizes nonprofits that exemplify unwavering and intentional human kindness in action. In February 2025, ARISE earned

Activities will include performance and instruction by Ballet Folclorico Xochihua;






