

In the 2022 CAPA Marquee Awards, 102 students from 18 area high schools are eligible to complete for Best Performer in a Leading Role and become a 2022 Jimmy Awards nominee.

Winners are determined by a combined production and audition score. Eligible student performers receive an adjudication score for their leading role in their school's production. Additionally, these student performers are invited to a panel audition held on March 19. At this audition, students must complete a song and a dance audition.

Through the adjudication



process, 102 eligible students will be narrowed down to 10 final nominees who will be named on April 14. Nominees will perform in our showcase on May 10 at the Ohio Theatre. At the end of the evening, the two winners will be announced.

Students selected as Best Actor in a Leading Role and Best Actress in a Leading Role will be designated as official Jimmy Award nominees and will receive a CAPA-sponsored trip to attend "Jimmys Week" in New York City, a training intensive with theatre professionals and industry experts, and will compete for scholarships and the national title. The Jimmy Awards will be held at the Minskoff Theatre on Broadway on Monday, June 27, at 7:30pm.

On Tuesday, May 10, at 7:30 pm at the Ohio Theatre, the 2022 CAPA Marquee Awards will culminate with a red-carpet ceremony and student showcase at which winners in 11 categories will be announced. The showcase will include live performances from the nominees for Best Musical Production and Best Performer in a Leading Role as well as opening and closing numbers that incorporate nominated students from all 18 participating high schools.

Tickets are \$15 for students and \$25 for adults.
