


more about the 2023-24 CAPA Marquee Awards.

Hosted by Mike McCarthy from Good Day Columbus, this event will give you a chance to walk the red carpet, strike your best pose



CAPA's Broadway in the Classroom program introduces students from Title 1 schools to musical theatre during an engaging curriculum-based program.





The goal of Broadway in the Classroom is to use the power of Broadway to serve as a tool to enhance curriculum and introduce Broadway to the next generation.

Participating schools engage in six weeks of show-related curriculum developed by their teacher and CAPA and aligned with Ohio Department of Education standards. At the end of the six weeks, students attend a Broadway show, share their final projects, and have the chance to connect with cast and crew members from the tour.


This year, two Columbus City high schools participated in

the program. Students from Marion-Franklin High School and Columbus Africentric Early College worked on curriculum designed around the musical, COME FROM AWAY. To help extend learning further, CAPA sent teaching artists, Cynthia Amoah and Julie Whitney-Scott to work with students on lessons exploring storytelling, monologue writing, and poetry.

On February 2, students attended a pre-show reception, a performance of COME FROM AWAY at the Palace Theatre, and a postshow talkback with cast members, Chelsea LaValley

and Andrew Harvey.

Want to earn volunteer hours?

ARISE (ARts through Intergenerational Social Engagement), a collaboration between CAPA, GrowIN, The Ohio State University, and Worthington Christian Village, and At Home by High is a fiveweek intergenerational program focused on storytelling through the fine arts.

The ARISE Scholars Program will provide teens who are currently in grades 9-12 with the opportunity to earn 25 service hours, to volunteer in the community, and to experience how the fine arts can be used as a tool for wellness.

The central theme of ARISE is storytelling. Throughout the program, we will explore how theatre, music, dance, and the visual arts can help us share our stories with others.







Each student who completes the program will earn a \$100 TRAVEL STIPEND.













Schooled on Poetry, a collaboration between CAPA, the Thurber House, ESCCO, the Poetry Foundation, the Columbus Foundation and poet-educator Peter Kahn is the culminating celebration of a year-long Spoken Word poetry project at Dublin Scioto, Grandview Heights, Independence, KIPP and Northland high schools.

The culminating event will be held at the Lincoln Theatre on Saturday, May 11 at 7pm. There will be intra-school group pieces and individual original poems by slam champs from each



school. They will be joined by local poets Hanif Abdurragib and Cynthia Amoah, and Chicago-

Our goal is to showcase the


power of poetry to the Columbus community in a diverse way so that writers of all ages and backgrounds can see poetry as an accessible form of
