




The magnificent 1928 "Mighty Morton" theatre organ is equipped to create a variety of sound effects using bells,

cymbals, drums, whistles, and marbles (to make the sound of waves). All of these devices, as well as its complex network of pipes, are hidden behind the gilded ornamentation surrounding the stage.
