In addition to the 10 award categories our production adjudicators evaluate for each year, we have 3 award categories which are submitted to us through an application process: Backstage Excellence, Outstanding **Student Designer, and National Student** Reporter.

Backstage Excellence

Honors a group of students for demonstrating teamwork, professionalism, and a commitment to excellence behind-the-scenes. Student run crews, costume crews,

set construction crews. stagehands or any group of students who have dedicated time in a backstage capacity are eligible.

Directors may nominate one group of students each year for this award. Nominations are reviewed by a panel of local theatre professionals who will select winners to be honored at the CAPA Marguee Awards Showcase.

Outstanding Student Designer

Honors a student who demonstrates artistry, skill, and a commitment to excellence in costume. hair and makeup, scenic, sound, lighting, or props design.





Students self-submit for this award through an application process. Students may only submit one application for this award, but the design application may include multiple design areas. Applications are reviewed by a panel of local theatre professionals who will select winners to be honored at the CAPA Marquee Awards Showcase.

An informational session for student designers will be held on March 6 from 4–5pm.

National Student Reporter

The National High School Musical Theatre Awards[®] is seeking two student reporters from around the country to travel to New York to cover the 2024 Jimmy Awards[®] on social media on both the official Jimmy Awards[®] channels and the student reporters' personal channels.

Students self-submit for this award by creating a video up to 60 seconds in length showing how they would uniquely cover The Jimmy Awards[®] on social media, focusing on the promotion of the live stream of the ceremony. Applications are reviewed by a panel of local theatre professionals who will select up to two outstanding high school students who will be nominated to represent central Ohio in the national competition.

An informational session for student reporters will be held on February 6 from 4-5pm.





My students gave me my Mister C name! I've been an educator for 20 years, and many of those years were spent as a 5th grade science teacher. When I first started teaching, students immediately abbreviated my name. Instead of calling me Mr. Cornell in class, they would simply call me Mister C.


Mister C is the creator and host for the Emmy award-winning show DIY Science Time which is aired all across the country! Mister C is no stranger to finding exciting and engaging ways to explore STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math) in our everyday lives.

On March 5, Kevin Cornell (aka Mister C) is coming to Columbus to perform as part of our Passport to Learning Series.

We caught up with him to learn more about his mission as an educator and performer, his show, and his love of STEAM!

2. If you could share one thing with us about STEAM what would it be?

STEAM is a superpower! It doesn't matter if you're in elementary school, high school, college or even already out working in your career, STEAM is found in our everyday lives. STEAM provides us a way to harness a better understanding of how the world works and use scientific processes and methodologies to solve problems and to create unlimited opportunities to not only better our own lives, but the lives of everyone around us. And the greatest part about all of this amazing power that STEAM gives, is that EVERYONE can use it!



3. Why do you incorporate music and media into your show about science?

4. If you could have dinner with a scientist, dead or alive, who would you dine with and why?

Music and media are the way that STEAM comes alive in my shows! Audiences are able to have deeper, more meaningful and memorable connections with the topics explored in my shows through my music. We're so busy having fun, singing, and dancing that audience members often forget that they are also learning too! Weaving these artful and scientific experiences together leaves the audience humming and singing about the concepts we learned together!

Thomas Edison would be on the top of my list. While we all know that Edison invented the incandescent light bulb, most are not aware of his many failed inventions and ideas. Edison had thousands of ideas that didn't work. Rather than let those failures discourage him, he let those failures inspire him to keep experimenting and testing in hopes the next attempt would be successful. I want my audiences to know that mistakes and mess ups are more than just okay, and that they are part of the path to success! Plus, when things go wrong and get messy, it's always so much more fun!

5. What is your advice to kids who might want to pursue a career in math or science?

Explore more about the things that you love, and you'll quickly realize that you likely are already using math and science. Whether you're using physics to better understand a sport you enjoy playing or chemistry to create pieces of colorful art, science and math can elevate whatever your interests may be. Always let your learning be inspired and make sure your learning is fun!

10 Seconds

On February 5–25, we will present a free virtual arts engagement of 10 Seconds.

In a world where deeply rooted biases and misperceptions easily take hold, life can often feel unnerving, and things can change for the better or worse in the blink of an eye.

Ray and Jimi are Washington, DC high school students who are navigating their young adult worlds and what it means to be young black men in the city. Ray tells the story of a day, and the 10 seconds inside that day, that they will never forget. We see not only their perspectives, but also those of the police they encounter. Through audience engagement and interactive moments, the play provides opportunities for reflection and discussion.

> Imagination Stage commissioned playwright Miriam Gonzales to write this play, which is part of its Theatre for Change programming and based on two years of workshops with DC police officers and young people ages 12–18. This performance is recommended for mature student audiences.
